Harman Elementary gym floor replaced



The gymnasium floor at Harman Elementary is being replaced due to water damage to the old wooden floor. The new floor is a multi-purpose surface that is moisture proof and will better accommodate the variety of activities that occur in Harman's smaller gymnasium. Currently the gym is used for physical education classes, Oakwood Community Center first/second grade basketball, and related PTO functions. But, the new floor will not be ready when school opens on Aug. 25, and accommodations will be made for physical education classes until it is ready.

According to Oakwood School Treasurer Kevin Philo, in the late spring of 2009, discoloration of the wooden floor was noted. Air-quality tests showed nothing unacceptable in the air. In June, engineers and architects were brought in to assess the situation. Demolition began on the old floor to determine the cause of the excess moisture. After many different tests, it was determined that slight failures in drain pipes and roofing may have contributed to the problem along with a baseball that managed somehow to get into the drainage system from the roof. After those problems were corrected, extra-ordinary measures were taken to insure that future moisture problems will not occur in that area, including waterproof paint and a thick industrial vapor barrier installed below six inches of new concrete, which was poured on July 30th. It will take approximately four to six weeks for the concrete to properly cure so that installation of a new synthetic surface can occur. It is anticipated that the new floor will be completed in early to mid-September.

Mrs. Allyson Couch, Harman Elementary Principal, stated, "Since the new gym floor will not be ready by the start of school, physical education classes will be held outside (weather permitting) or in the cafeteria/auditorium area. The Harman staff is making all the necessary arrangements and instructional plans to ensure that the students' physical education needs are met throughout this transition."
