best-known landmark Deeds Carillon aka Carillon Bells. In the same vein, Wright State Dance Department produced an evening of five world premieres. The program is led by Teressa Wylie McWilliams, Justin Gibbs and Gina Gardner Walther - all great dancers who now impart their knowledge, taste and talents to a large body of dance majors. The professors of dance invited choreography by national choreographer Jon Lehrer, Dayton Ballet II director Megan Reckamp Forney, DCDC's Shonna Hickman-Matlock, Dayton Ballet's iconic dancer and choreographer, Gregory Robinson, as well as senior student Elizabeth Ramsey.

The first half of the program could be described as sturm und drang, storm and stress. Gina Walther's "Revel in the Now" was a continuum of twirls, tumbles and dramatic poses. In the same vein, Gibbs' "A Gathering of Crows," transformed serious mood and energy into expressive solos, duets and ensembles.

Elizabeth Ramsey's "Depths" had her dancers emerge from the floor writhing, almost struggling to survive. McWilliams' "The Cost" spoke about the horrors of war and the price of freedom in the language of dance.

The second half of the concert had the smiles, freed from emotional pain. DCDC II, always irrepressible, was electric in Hickman-Matlock's allegro ballet. Dancers en pointe returned to beautifully costumed and mellifluous ballet by Dayton Ballet II troupe under Forney.

Lehrer, in "Pantheon Rising" had his dancers move across the stage in phalanx style. The fluid precision and complex patterns were engaging.

It was Gregory Robinson's "Girls, Girls, Girls" that produced many of the moments of magic. The troupe, in stunning bright orange pant suits, had an energetic ensemble introduce solos and a duet that captured the spirit of dance. Alex Caldwell's solo dominated the stage. Easily the dancer of the evening, beautiful Alex made every movement prepare the eye for its next permutation.

Taylor Ramos had a personality-filled solo that could only be described as "ultra cute." A duet, Emily Monsour and Onjelee Phomhirath, let their effervescent personalities light up the stage.

I was amazed to learn that each of the solos were triple cast so that different dancers would have the experience of the spotlight. That meant that Greg would teach each dance three times, coach it into performance mode and then sit back, exhausted but happy.

Greg said that the entire company worked so hard and were eager to learn and accomplish. He said "I threw everything I could at them and they took it to the skies." That they did and the thunderous applause of the audience showed it was received with joy.

Congratulations to each member of the department, student and faculty. We saw real dance, real expression and real talent. And we really loved it.
